Professor in the Faculty of Law at the University of Alberta, having obtained his LL.B. from the University of Edinburgh and his LL.M. from McGill University. He is also a practicing Barrister and Solicitor in Alberta. Professor Robertson's main research interests lie in the fields of health law and personal injury law. His textbooks include *Legal Liability of Doctors and Hospitals in Canada* (coauthored with Madam Justice Ellen Picard), the 4th edition of which was published in September 2007 and *Mental Disability and the Law in Canada*. He has published numerous articles in legal and medical journals in Canada, the United States and the United Kingdom.
