

Thomas H. Gallagher, M.D.

Thomas Gallagher, M.D., is a general internist who is an Associate Professor in the Departments of Medicine and Medical History & Ethics at the University of Washington. Dr. Gallagher received his medical degree from Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, completed his residency in Internal Medicine at Barnes Hospital, Washington University, St. Louis, and completed a fellowship in the Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholars Program, UCSF.

Dr. Gallagher has a long-standing research interest in the ethical and communication dimensions of conflicts of interest, research ethics, and disclosure of medical errors and adverse events. His work in error disclosure received the 2004 Best Published Research Paper of the Year award from the Society of General Internal Medicine. Dr. Gallagher's articles on disclosure have appeared in journals including *JAMA*, *New England Journal of Medicine*, *Surgery*, *Journal of Clinical Oncology*, *Archives of Internal Medicine*, *Archives of Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine*, and *the Joint Commission Journal*. He is supported by grants from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality and the Greenwall Foundation Faculty Scholars in Bioethics program.

Dr. Gallagher is an active member of many professional organizations, including the American College of Physicians (Fellow), American Society of Law, Medicine, and Ethics, Society of General Internal Medicine, and the American Society of Bioethics and Humanities.
