5. Lab Renovations


Terry indicated that Phase II at the HSC has finally been completed and Phase III is now starting.

5. Pathologists' Workload

Dr. Cook brought this issue forward as some of the Pathologists at the HSC site have complained that their workload is heavier than the Pathologists at St. Clare's.

Dr. Cook indicated that he was going to ask Dr. Pushpanathan to assume responsibility for all products of conception at the HSC. This is approximately 400 specimens/year.

Dr. Cook asked Terry about the possibility and impact of transferring the specimens from Labrador City to St. Clare's from the HSC. Terry indicated that since the vast majority of these specimens are grossed by the Technologist II's, the laboratory could facilitate this request by sending the slides to St. Clare's for the Pathologists to interpret.

There are approximately 600-800 specimens per year from Labrador City and would also mean lost revenue for the HSC Pathologists as they will no longer interpret these specimens.
